>>> SkillsUSA College/Postsecondary Scholarships Open

SkillsUSA members anticipating tuition expenses for the summer or fall 2025 academic terms can apply for scholarships from SkillsUSA and our generous industry partners. Scholarship applications require a letter of recommendation from a SkillsUSA advisor or another instructor, a resume and a brief



essay. Funds for scholarship awards are remitted directly to postsecondary institutions and applied to the student's account balance.
