Celebrating gives students a sense of individual and team accomplishment and builds enthusiasm to continue in SkillsUSA next year. Here are a few ideas for your celebration.

- Host a banquet for the chapter and invite supporters and families. Recognize student members for their leadership roles, demonstrated teamwork and completed projects.
- Hold an appreciation circle. Individually, each student sits in a chair at the top of the circle, and everyone
 recognizes that person for their contributions to the chapter or specific projects this year.
- Plan a fun after school activity: have a cookout at the park, go bowling or play miniature golf.
- Post photos and write ups about graduating members on a bulletin board in the classroom or hallway.
- Write an article for the school newsletter, website or social media and highlight the officers and projects
- Recognize students at a school assembly, faculty meeting or school board meeting.
- Place a jar and note cards in the classroom and ask students to write notes of appreciation to each other.
